

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
A Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) is an online course aiming at large-scale interactive participation and open access via the web.

- Massive: everyone can join it, no limits
- Open: all the information (content and interactions) is open to all on the web
- Online: all content happen online
- Course: a stand alone or part of a training
- Course content is not located in any place, it can be found all over the world.
- Moocs are free;
- The courses do not have specific requirements, but active participants are required to stay up, MOOCs have to engage the audience
- Participants and instructions aggregate, remix and repurpose content
- True to its name, MOOCs can be **massive** with a few hundred to several thousand participants engaged in a course simultaneously all over the world










How to engage an audience when you speak on camera (or in public)?





- Stop trying to be perfect!
- Smile with your eyes
- Speak naturally
- Use **language** appropriate for your audience.
- Underline and reinforce the key words of your speech
- Practice looking into the camera as you speak
- Sit up straight
- Be genuine, be yourself in order to engage the audience



Links between Art, Theatre and Politics





- The goal is to provoke doubts, reaction, questions
- We have to be genuine in order to be believable
- Creating a connection with your audience and helping them feel involved
- Involve the audience and make them aware of your message
- Performers and activists
 have often the same goal (it
 doesn't mean to pretend).


